In 2008, Hyaets expanded their ministry to two hospitality houses. The "Parkway" house is just two houses away from the "Tuck" house, providing even more opportunities to reach out to neighbors. Children come from broken or abusive homes. They are often left to plan meals, supervise siblings and maintain the home on their own. The Hyaets homes provide safe, nurturing environments where children can experience the love of Christ. Neighborhood adults

Ministry with People - share stories, tutor, disciple, do crafts with kids, host a teen mom luncheon/party

Ministry with Tools - help with Hyaets household maintenance and repair (i.e., install ceramic tile, plumbing, gardening/yard work, install screens/doors, paint)

Ministry for Personal Growth - participate in an Urban Immersion or a Poverty Simulation Experience

Ministry without Leaving Home - provide/prepare supplies for mission teams, share the Hyaets story with other Richmond congregations, become a pen pal with a Hyaets child.

Owsley County, Kentucky

New - beginning 2010!

In late 2009, the EoE team discerned God's call to become involved in ministry in Owsley County ("The OC"), identified by CBF as one of the twenty poorest counties in America. We have spent time with local pastors Jerry and Susie Lacefield, as well as with other committed community members, learning about the community and its people, and hearing about how we can minister to their needs.

Food Place is an ever-present ministry in Owsley County. Managed by the Lacefields, it provides regular food assistance to the people of Owsley County. The Lacefields also manage a Clothes Closet to provide clothing for those in the community in need. Both Food Place and Clothes Closet depend heavily on volunteer labor and contributions.

Although Owsley County has some ministries in place, they tell us that any talent can be used! As you volunteer your time, skills, and ideas, HRBC will develop its own missions personality and presence in Owsley County!

Some ways to begin:

Ministry with People - visit with senior adults, speak to the local church youth group

Ministry with Tools - help with household maintenance and repair

Ministry with Skills - tutor GED students, lead job application workshops

Ministry without Leaving Home - provide/prepare supplies for mission teams, collect items (food, clothing, housewares) to add to Food Pantry and Clothes Closet, send school supplies to an OC classroom.

CARITAS SHELTER - Every year in March, the gym becomes home for one week to some of the homeless people in Richmond. There are many needs to be filled during the week. They include: meal preparation, overnight hosts, laundry, shower escorts, entertainment and friendly faces. Come out and spend some time with our guests. CAMP ALKULANA - Richmond Baptists support Camp Alkulana to provide a summer wilderness experience for inner-city children who would not otherwise be able to go to a camp. DISASTER RELIEF TRAINING - Disaster Relief (DR) volunteers are unpaid individuals who receive specific training and volunteer their time and efforts to minister to the victims of disaster. Volunteers can train to serve in: feeding unit, water purification unit, recovery unit, laundry unit or child care unit. Training takes one day. Upon completion volunteers receive an ID badge, t-shirt and cap.

BLAND COUNTY - The main focus of this annual June mission is the dental clinic. However, there are many other opportunities to serve. Food pantry, clothes closet, household repair, construction

THE CLINIC - Mid-September HRBC opens its doors to assist those in need of special services. We offer medical, dental, haircuts, clothes, food, household items, school supplies and much more.
